FBI Silent On Floridian's 'Agents' Story

The FBI in Dallas had no comment Thursday on a statement made by a Florida man that his brother had fled Dallas following the assassination of President Kennedy because of harassment by "agents."

Wire service reports said the statement was made by Earl Killam in regard to his late brother, Thomas Henry Killam, who was married to an employe at Jack Ruby's Carousel Club in Dallas.

Earl Killam said his brother told him he was being harassed by agents in Dallas. He said his brother did not specify who the agents were.

Dallas Police said Thursday they had no knowledge of Thomas Henry Killam, whose death in 1964 is being probed by Florida authorities.

Killam was not mentioned in the Warren Commission's report but his wife Wanda Joyce was.

The Warren Commission said it had found "very few possible links" between Jack Ruby and Lee Harvey Oswald, but one conceivable association was through John Carter, an acquaintance of Mrs. Killam.

The commission's report said that Carter was a boarder at 1025 N. Beckley Ave. during the time that Oswald lived there and that he "was friendly with Wanda Joyce Killam, who had known Jack Ruby since shortly after he moved to Dallas in 1947 and worked for him from July 1963 to early November 1963."

The report stated that Mrs. Killam said in a voluntary interview that she "did not believe Carter ever visited (Ruby's) Carousel Club and that she did not think Carter knew Ruby."

Carter also denied knowing Ruby, the report said.

The Warren Commission concluded that it had "no reason to disbelieve either Mrs. Killam or Carter."
