(KENNEDY ASSASSINATION)

NEW ORLEANS--A THREE-JUDGE PANEL TODAY REFUSED TO THROW OUT DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON'S ACCUSATIONS THAT BUSINESSMAN CLAY SHAW CONSPIRED TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT KENNEDY.

THE PANEL ORDERED SHAW, 54-YEAR-OLD FORMER MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE NEW ORLEANS TRADE MART, HELD FOR "FURTHER STEPS OF LAW IN THIS CASE."

IT WAS NOT IMMEDIATELY SPECIFIED WHETHER THIS MEANT HE WAS TO GO TO TRIAL ON GARRISON'S CHARGES, OR WHETHER OTHER LEGAL PROCEDURES WERE TO BE FOLLOWED FIRST.

PRESIDING JUDGE BERNARD J. BAGERT READ THE RULING AFTER CONFERRING FOR 35 MINUTES IN HIS CHAMBERS WITH JUDGES MATTHEW F. BRANIFF AND MALCOLM V. O'HARA.

BAGERT ORDERED SHAW'S \$10,000 BOND CONTINUED.

SHAW SHOWED NO OUTWARD EMOTION AS HE SAT DIRECTLY FACING JUDGE BAGERT WHILE THE ORDER WAS READ.

HE ROSE, SMILING BROADLY, AS THE JUDGES LEFT AND SPOKE A FEW WORDS TO CRIMINAL SHERIFF LOUIS HEYD.
