Garrison Probe NEW ORLEANS_Two television newsmen who inevision newsmen who he vestigated the controversial Kennedy assassination probe appeared here to face charges filed by District Attorney Jim Garrison.

Walter Sheridan, 41, of Washington, an investigative reporter for the National Broadcasting Co., surren-dered at the criminal dis-trict court clerk's office and posted \$5000 bond.

Before he left, Sheridan, charged with trying to bribe a Garrison witness into changing his story, was sub-poenaed to appear before the Orleans Parish grand jury Wednesday.

Richard Townley, a report-er for WDSU-TV in New Orleans, an NBC affiliate, stood in criminal district court to plead innocent to a similar bribery charge.


