Garrison Attacked At Perjury Trial

NEW ORLEANS—Attorney Dean Andrews Jr. handled his own defense at the opening of his perjury trial yesterday and launched an altack on New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison's Investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy.

Andrews moved to have Garrison dismissed as the prosecutor in his case. He charged that Garrison "does not possess any evidence to demonstrate the existence of a conspiracy in New Orleans to assassinate President Kennedy."

The perjury charge was made after he testified June 28 before the Orleans Parish grand Jury in connection with Garrison's investigation.

Andrews told the Warren Commission that a Clay Bertrand asked him after the assassination to represent Lee Harvey Oswald. He denies Garrison's contention that Bertrand was actually Clay Shaw, a local businessman.
