 1ST ADD ASSASSINATION NEW ORLEANS 024A XXX SHAW.
 "THEY WANTED HIM (ANDREWS) TO CHANGE HIS STORY, BUT HE AIN'T THAT
 KIND OF GUY," BURGESS SAID.

PROSECUTOR JAMES ALCOCK CHARGED THAT ANDREWS TOLD SEVERAL DIFFERENT
 AND CONFLICTING STORIES ABOUT BERTRAND. HE SAID THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY
 WAS ONLY SEEKING THE TRUTH, EVEN IF THE TRUTH WAS THAT ANDREWS HAD
 MADE UP THE STORY ABOUT THE 1963 BERTRAND PHONE CALL.

THE DEFENSE SUNDAY PRESENTED THE ENTIRE TWO HOUR TAPED RECORDING
 OF ANDREWS' TESTIMONY TO THE GRAND JURY. IT SAID THE TAPE SHOWED
 THAT THE INDICTMENT WAS BASED ON STATEMENTS TAKEN OUT OF CONTEXT.

THROUGHOUT THE GRAND JURY SESSION ANDREWS COMPLAINED THAT HE WAS
 BEING PUSHED TO ANSWER QUESTIONS ABOUT BERTRAND THAT HE COULD NOT
 ANSWER.

"YOU'RE PICKING ME LIKE A CHICKEN, SHUCKING ME LIKE CORN," HE SAID.

ALCOCK SAID THE ANDREWS PERJURY CASE WAS "IMPORTANT TO THIS
 COUNTRY" BECAUSE IT WAS IMPORTANT TO THE ASSASSINATION INVESTIGATION
 BEING CONDUCTED BY GARRISON AND THE GRAND JURY.

EARLIER SUNDAY NEWSMAN HUGH AYNESWORTH OF HOUSTON TESTIFIED THAT
 GARRISON TOLD HIM ON MARCH 2 ANDREWS KNEW NOTHING ABOUT THE SHAW CASE.
 HE ALSO SAID GARRISON THREATENED "TO GET" ANDREWS BECAUSE ANDREWS HAD
 BEEN HANDING HIM A LOT OF "BULL" IN PREVIOUS WEEKS.
