New Orleans Inquiry

NEW ORLEANS—Lee Harvey Oswald, Jack Ruby and retired New Orleans businessman Clay L. Shaw met Sept. 3, 1963, in Baton Rouge, District Attorney Jim Garrison's office said.

The date was furnished Shaw's attorneys in compliance with an order by Criminal District Court Judge Frank J. Shea. Shaw is accused of conspiring in September, 1963, with Oswald and others to assassinate President Kennedy.

Garrison said in June that Shaw once met with Ruby and Oswald at the Jack Tar Capital House in Baton Rouge and handed them money.

In reply to a defense request for more details, Garrison's office said the meeting occurred from 2 to 9 p.m. on Sept. 3, 1963.

In reply to another request by Shaw's attorneys for details, Garrison's office said Shaw went to Portland, Ore., in November, 1963, in furtherance of the alleged conspiracy. The route took him through Houston, Los

Angeles and San Francisco, Garrison's aides said.
