UPI-24 (KENNEDY ASSASSINATION)

DALLAS--A FORMER DALLAS CAB DRIVER WAS SAID HE DROVE LEE HARVEY OSWALD, DAVID FERRIE AND AN OLDER MAN FROM NEAR JACK RUBY'S APARTMENT TO RUBY'S NIGHTCLUB ABOUT SIX MONTHS PRIOR TO JOHN KENNEDY'S MURDER, SOURCES REPORTED YESTERDAY.

THE EX-CAB DRIVER, RAYMOND CUMMINGS, 35, REPORTEDLY TOLD MEMBERS OF NEW ORLEANS DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON'S STAFF HE COULD POSITIVELY IDENTIFY OSWALD BECAUSE HE AND THE ASSASSIN SWAPPED STORES ABOUT THE MARINE CORPS ON A TRIP OSWALD TOOK IN HIS CAB TO HIS SUBURBAN IRVING HOME.

CUMMINGS REPORTEDLY TOLD GARRISON'S INVESTIGATORS THAT TEN DAYS LATER, CUMMINGS PICKED UP A FARE NEAR JACK RUBY'S APARTMENT IN THE OAK CLIFF SECTION OF DALLAS AND TOOK THEM TO RUBY'S NIGHTCLUB.

HE SAID TWO OF THOSE MEN WERE LEE HARVEY OSWALD AND DAVID FERRIE. CUMMINGS WAS SAID TO HAVE TOLD THE INVESTIGATORS THAT HE AND OSWALD AGAIN SPOKE OF THEIR MARINE CORPS DAYS.

CUMMINGS REPORTEDLY SAID HE IDENTIFIED FERRIE FROM PICTURES OF HIM IN NEWSPAPERS RECENTLY.

CUMMINGS ATTORNEY, FRANK WRIGHT, WHO HAS ADVISED CUMMINGS NOT TO SPEAK TO NEWSMEN ABOUT THE SITUATION, SAID CUMMINGS WILL MEET WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DALLAS COUNTY DIST. ATTY.'S OFFICE TODAY.

NEW ORLEANS--TWO WITNESSES, AT THE REQUEST OF DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON, APPEARED BEFORE THE NEW ORLEANS GRAND JURY YESTERDAY, BUT INFORMATION IN GARRISON'S PROBE OF THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY STILL REMAINS CLOUDY.

UNLESS GARRISON UNEXPECTEDLY ANNOUNCES SOME NEW DEVELOPMENTS, WHICH HE HAS DONE IN THE PAST, PUBLIC CURIOSITY ABOUT THE INVESTIGATION WILL HAVE TO WAIT UNTIL TUESDAY.

A PRELIMINARY HEARING ON EVIDENCE AGAINST THE ONLY PERSON ARRESTED IN THE INVESTIGATION HAS BEEN SET FOR TUESDAY.

AT THE HEARING GARRISON MUST PRESENT EVIDENCE HE RELIED ON IN ARRESTING CLAY L. SHAW, 54, A PROMINENT NEW ORLEANS BUSINESSMAN WHO IS CHARGED WITH CONSPIRACY TO MURDER.

MRS. JOSEPHINE HUG AND DEAN A. ANDREWS SPENT A TOTAL OF 43 MINUTES BEHIND CLOSED DOORS TALKING TO THE GRAND JURY YESTERDAY PRESUMABLY ABOUT THE INVESTIGATION. NEITHER WOULD SPEAK TO NEWSMEN OUTSIDE THE JURY ROOM.

MRS. HUG, WHO ONCE WORKED FOR SHAW, WAS IN THE ROOM 34 MINUTES AND ANDREWS, AN ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY IN NEIGHBORING JEFFERSON PARISH, SPENT NINE MINUTES.
