# Garrison Should Be Investigated

Louisiana state and county authorities should suspend publicity-hungry Jim Garrison from his post as New Orleans district attorney immediately. It has become apparent long since that no citizen anywhere in the United States is safe from slander as long as his garrulous individual is able to take advantage of his position as a public official. He is, in fact, a threat to the civil rights of everyone, and his activities warrant investigation.

Garrison has discredited himself shamefully by his silly attempt to become a sort of Agent 637 at the cost of others' reputations. He should not be permitted longer to abuse his privileges as a law enforcement officer. Many citizens may have believed him when he first claimed to have new facts about the Kennedy assassination, but very few persons place any reliance on his wild statements now.

Garrison lost any claim to credibility when his accusations went far beyond decency and probity by inferring that President Johnson and FBI Director

Hoover are concealing facts about the Lee Harvey Oswald case. The reckless accusations against Mr. Johnson and Mr. Hoover are bad enough, but even more irresponsible and dangerous is Garrison's habit of accusing private citizens through the communications media before any charges are filed.

From the moment he grabbed for the headlines more than a year ago, Garrison's numerous statements have been suspect. If there were any truth in them, the action required would not be within a district attorney's jurisdiction. It would be a matter to be dealt with at the highest national level of law enforcement. As an attorney, Garrison should be the first to realize his office is not the one to handle a presidential assassination case.

Meanwhile, how about the American Civil Liberties Union taking an interest in the civil rights of citizens who are being tried in public through the leftist side of Garrison's loud mouth? . . .
