Radio Evangelist Backs Valley Aide, Raps Garrison Quiz

Dr. Carl McIntire kicked off the "Logan Eugene Bradley Defense Fund" to the tune of \$2000 in the Valley this week, and launched — with an evangelistic flourish — a scathing attack against New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison.

Radio evangelist McIntire claimed Garrison's investigation of the assassination of John Kennedy "is aiding the Communists," and Garrison, in fact, is "being used" by the Reds.

The New Orleans DA has accused Bradley of North Hollywood with being involved in a conspiracy plotting the presidential assassination.

McIntire, who employs Bradley as a public relations man, lashed out against communism, socialism, modernism and "Garrisonism" in his speech Thursday night to more than 700 people at the Faith Baptist Church in Canoga Park.

Besides getting pledges amounting to more than \$2000 to help pay legal expenses for Bradley's defense, the right-wing evangelist seemed to get overwhelming support of the Valley residents present in a letter-writing campaign to Gov. Ronald Reagan.

He called on the citizens to urge Reagan to refuse to permit extradition of the North Hollywood man to Louisiana as Garrison has requested.

Refer to Charges

McIntire claimed that people in Milwaukee, Chicago and St. Louis, where he has held rallies recently, already have started writing letters to the California Governor.

Referring to his charges aimed at Garrison, McIntire said, "The Communists would like to get at the only radio broadcast which goes out after them."

His "20th Century Reformation Hour" is carried by various radio stations throughout the United States and in some parts of Canada.

He was interrupted often by applause.

The audience enthusiastically displayed its approval especially when McIntire launched tirades against "liberal left-wingers," and publications such as Ramparts magazine.

He also was highly critical of newspapers in general.

He said the charges against Bradley have caused suspicions to arise about himself, and that in some cases, financial help has been withdrawn as a direct result of Garrison's accusations.

McIntire condemned Garrison's contention that right-wingers were behind the assassination of Kennedy.

"Win Policy"

"The one thing I do agree with the Warren Report about, is that Lee Harvey Oswald did indeed kill the President," he said. "However, the Warren Commission did not go a step further to prove that Oswald was working in conjunction with the Communists."

At various times, the evangelist spoke out on Vietnam, and called rather fervently for a "win policy." McIntire also pleaded for a "return to this country's basic ideals and principles."

News accounts of Garrison's charges against Bradley which linked the North Hollywood man with his employer, or referred to Bradley merely as McIntire's aide, took the brunt of the attack.

Bradley Quiet

He added, "God help the American people when they read their newspapers. But I can always trust the Bible."

Bradley himself sat behind the pulpit where McIntire spoke, but remained quiet most of the time.

McIntire also called for congressional investigations, preferably by the House un-American activities committee, of Garrison and Mark Lane, also a severe critic of the Warren Report.
