— Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison yesterday subpoenaed the widow of Presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald to testify in Mr. Garrison's probe of the Kennedy assassination. Mrs. Marina Oswald Porter, said she doubted she could help.

But Mrs. Porter, now a suburban Dallas housewife, did not say whether she would try to fight a subpoena ordering her to come to New Orleans to testify before a grand jury Feb. 2.

"I don't know if I could prove my innocence to him," Mrs. Porter said at her home in Richardson, Tex. "Mr. Garrison so powerful."

The subpoena said the Russian-born Mrs. Porter "would have knowledge of Lee Harvey Oswald's activities and associates" when the pair resided in New Orleans from July 1963 to September 1963.
