### Across the Nation

**Hoodlum Teachers'**  
**CHICAGO** — The Office of Economic Opportunity has clamped down on The Woodlawn Organization (TWO) for hiring street gang members under criminal charges. It threatened to remove \$972,000 in Federal grants.

OEO said the organization must get rid of employees charged with "serious crime such as murder or rape," and held it responsible for keeping its training premises clear of drink, drugs, violence or dangerous weapons.

A probe showed that eight persons hired have records or are awaiting trial and that a "teacher" has been charged with murder in the shooting of a trainee.

OEO also ruled out the practice of giving the staff bonuses for hiring dropouts.

### Acquittal Protest

**DAYTON, Ohio** — About 500 persons marched here yesterday to protest the acquittal of a policeman who was charged with the fatal shooting of a Negro civil rights worker last Sept. 17.

Robert Collier, charged with manslaughter in the death of Robert Barbee and later suspended from the force, was freed Monday by an all-white jury after four hours deliberation. He has not yet been reinstated and a hearing is set for Feb. 7.

Collier was accused of killing Barbee and then placing a gun on his body to make it appear Negro was armed. He testified that he thought Barbee's smoking pipe was a gun.

### Killer to Die

**OPELIKA, Ala.** — Edward Seibold, accused slayer of three Auburn, Ala., girls, was convicted yesterday on a second murder charge and sentenced to die in the electric chair March 15, the same date that had been set in the first case.

He is now convicted of murdering Sarah Elizabeth Sinclair, 18, and her sister, Mary Lynn Sinclair, 9. He faces another charge of slaying Mary Durant, 8, a neighbor of the Sinclairs.

Seibold was accused of killing the girls in a fit of jealous rage last Sept. 6 because Cathy Sinclair sister of the two slain girls, refused to go out with him.

### Garrison Stymied

**LOS ANGELES** — California judges this week have denied two requests by New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison to extradite Californians sought in his probe of an alleged conspiracy to kill President Kennedy.

But Garrison is still trying to extradite Edgar Eugene Bradley, a broadcast salesman of North Hollywood, partly on the basis of a report that he posed as a Secret Service agent in Dallas on the day Mr. Kennedy was shot.

The denial of extradition against Lawrence J. Howard Jr., 33, of El Monte, and Loran E. Hall, 33, of Kernville, keeps Garrison's legging "street" intact. No state has surrendered a man to his probe and no one not from Louisiana has gone voluntarily to testify.
