## Garrison Locks Out DAs

New Orleans, March 17 (AP) — District Attorney James Garrison, saying he would not submit to any censorship, locked the National District Attorneys Association out of its convention banquet here last night.

Garrison, whose investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy has aroused a nationwide controversy, accused the association of attempting to censor remarks he had prepared on President Johnson, the federal government and courts. Some 600 persons attending the convention, unable to get into the French Quarter Hotel banquet room, went elsewhere to eat. Garrison said the food, worth more than \$3,000, was sent to orphan homes.

## Holdup Suspect Held

Albuquerque, N. M., March 17 (UPI) — Harry William Yates, 22, of Liberty, N. Y. surrendered to the FBI today. He was charged with the \$13,361 robbery of a Callicoon, N. Y. bank. Agents arrested Yates on a downtown street after Yates telephoned the FBI office and said he wanted to surrender.
