# Ask for JFK Autopsy File

General Sessions Judge Charles Halleck yesterday ordered Dr. James B. Rhoads, director of the National Archives, to appear in court Jan. 17 to explain why he should not cooperate with New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigation of what he alleges to be a possible conspiracy in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Judge Halleck signed the order yesterday after representatives from Mr. Garrison's office requested that Dr. Rhoads be subpoenaed as a witness in the conspiracy trial of Clay Shaw, a New Orleans businessman accused of masterminding a plot

against the late President Kennedy.

A spokesman for Mr. Garrison said that an attempt will be made to force Dr. Rhoads to bring all materials concerning the death of President Kennedy as exhibits for the trial.

Shortly after the assassination Nov. 22, 1963, in Dallas, Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis requested that all photographs and "personal information" regarding the assassination and the autopsy be sealed in the archives for not less than five years, and then released only to persons "with a serious purpose."

Mr. Garrison maintains that the 45 photographs taken during the autopsy and autopsy reports

will prove President Kennedy was shot by more than one man and that the fatal head wounds resulted from a shot fired from the front of the President.

The Warren Commission report concluded the death of President Kennedy was the act of one man, Lee Harvey Oswald, who was shot dead in the Dallas City Jail, three days after he was arrested by night club owner Jack Ruby. The commission said the fatal shot was fired from behind the motorcade but Mr. Garrison claims shots were fired from at least two directions.
