NEW ORLEANS--SILVER-HAIRED CLAY L. SHAW SAT SILENT AND STOIC TODAY IN THE SECOND DAY OF SELECTING A JURY TO TRY HIM ON CHARGES HE PLOTTED WITH LEE HARVEY OSWALD TO MURDER PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

ONLY TWO JURORS--A TRUCK DRIVER AND A MACHINE OPERATOR--HAD BEEN CHOSEN TO SIT IN JUDGMENT OF THE 55-YEAR-OLD FORMER NEW ORLEANS BUSINESSMAN.

FIXED OPINIONS, FINANCIAL PROBLEMS AND LEGAL ARGUMENTS SLOWED JURY SELECTION, WHICH IS EXPECTED TO TAKE AT LEAST A WEEK. TWENTY-FIVE OF THE FIRST 27 PROSPECTIVE JURORS WERE TURNED DOWN FOR ONE REASON OR ANOTHER.

SOME SAID THEY ALREADY HAD AN OPINION OF SHAW'S GUILT OR INNOCENCE, OTHERS CLAIMED THEY WERE SICK AND OTHERS SAID THEIR EMPLOYERS WOULD NOT PAY THEM DURING THE TRIAL, WHICH IS EXPECTED TO RUN TWO MONTHS OR LONGER.

NEW ORLEANS DOES NOT PAY CITIZENS FOR JURY DUTY.
