NEW ORLEANS (UPI)--THE CLAY L. SHAW ASSASSINATION CONSPIRACY TRIAL BEGINS ITS SIXTH AND FINAL WEEK MONDAY, THE DEFENSE SAYING IT EXPECTS TO REST ITS CASE WEDNESDAY.

THE ALL-MALE JURY COULD BEGIN DELIBERATIONS AND REACH A DECISION THURSDAY, THOUGH THAT WOULD NOT TAKE INTO ACCOUNT POSSIBLE TRIAL DELAYS OR PROSECUTION REBUTTAL WITNESSES.

CHIEF DEFENSE ATTORNEY F. IRVIN DYMOND HAD PLANNED A FOUR-DAY DEFENSE, WHICH WOULD HAVE MEANT RESTING TUESDAY. BUT IT WAS LEARNED THAT AN IMPORTANT WITNESS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE IN TIME FOR A TUESDAY DEFENSE CONCLUSION.

THE DEFENSE SUBPCOENAEED FORMER TEXAS GOV. JOHN CONNALLY AFTER THE STATE HAD SUBPCOENAEED HIM AND THEN CANCELLED THE SUBPOENA. DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON SAID CONNALLY HAD CHANGED HIS STORY ABOUT THE ASSASSINATION. WHILE GARRISON REFUSED TO SAY WHAT THE CHANGE WAS, HE SAID IT MADE CONNALLY A "HOSTILE WITNESS" AS FAR AS THE STATE WAS CONCERNED.

"I DON'T KNOW WHEN CONNALLY WILL APPEAR FOR THE DEFENSE," DYMOND SAID. "WE HAVEN'T GOT A RETURN ON HIS SUBPOENA YET."

SHAW, 55, WHITE-HAIRED MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE NEW ORLEANS INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART, WENT ON TRIAL JAN. 21 ON A CHARGE OF CONSPIRING WITH LEE HARVEY OSWALD AND DAVID W. FERRIE TO ASSASSINAT PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

KENNEDY WAS SLAIN IN DALLAS NOV. 22, 1963. THE WARREN REPORT SAID OSWALD, WHO ONCE TRIED TO BECOME A RUSSIAN CITIZEN, DID IT ALONE AND THERE WAS NO CREDITABLE EVIDENCE OF A CONSPIRACY.

ALONG WITH SHAW, THE PROSECUTION HAS TRIED THE WARREN REPORT, PRESENTING WITNESSES WHO CLAIM THEY HEARD FOUR--NOT THREE SHOTS--OR WHO SAID THE SHOTS CAME FROM THE "GRASSY KNOLL" AREA OF DEALEY PLAZA RATHER THAN A SIXTH FLOOR WINDOW OF THE TEXAS SCHOOL BOOK DEPOSITORY.

IN A BILL OF PARTICULARS DATED JUNE 5, 1967, GARRISON CHARGED THAT "CLAY L. SHAW TRAVELED FROM NEW ORLEANS TO BATON ROUGE, LA., IN THE FALL OF 1963 AND MET LEE HARVEY OSWALD AND RUBY AT THE CAPITOL HOUSE HOTEL AND THERE DELIVERED TO OSWALD AND RUBY A SUM OF MONEY."

IN A BILL OF PARTICULARS DATED JUNE 1, 1964, GARRISON CHARGED THAT "CLAY L. SHAW TRAVELLED FROM NEW ORLEANS TO BAYON ROUGE, LA., IN THE FALL OF 1963 AND MET LEE HARVEY OSWALD AND JACK RUBY AT THE CAPITOL HOUSE HOTEL AND THERE DELIVERED TO OSWALD AND RUBY A SUM OF MONEY."

BUT THE STATE RESTED ITS CASE WITHOUT BRINGING RUBY INTO IT AND RUBY'S NAME IS NOT EXPECTED TO COME UP DURING DEFENSE TESTIMONY.

ASSISTANT DIST. ATTY. ANDREW SCIAMBRA, WHO FORGED NO PUGH OF THE CASE AGAINST SHAW, WAS ASKED WHY RUBY WAS EXCLUDED FROM THE CHARGE IT CAME TO TRIAL.

"I DON'T WANT TO DISCUSS THAT," SCIAMBRA REPLIED.
