Shaw Sues Garrison, A

NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 27 (UPI)—Clay L. Shaw filed a \$5-million suit today against District Attorney Jim Garri-son for an "illegal, unwarranl-ed, fraudulent and useless" investigation of the assassina-tion of President John F. Kention of President John F. Kennedy.

Shaw was acquitted March 1, 1969, of Garrison's charges

-1, 1969, of Garrison's charges that he conspired to assassinate Kennedy.

The suit accused Garrison and others of knowingly soliciting and using perjured testimony in the prosecution of Shaw and of d r u g g i n g, hypnotizing and bribing witnesses

Besides Garrison, the suit

Besides Garrison, the sult named as defendants Cecil M. Shilstone, Willard E. Robert-

Shilstone, Willard E. Robertson, Joseph M. Rault Jr. and Perry Raymond Russo.
Shilstone, Robertson and Rault are wealthy New Ofleans businessmen who headed a group called Truth and Consequences Inc., which was formed to provide financial backing for the Garrison investigation.

Russo was the prosecution star witness,
