# Shaw Sues Garrison <sup>A-4</sup> In Trial Case

NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 27 (UPI)—Clay L. Shaw filed a \$5-million suit today against District Attorney Jim Garrison for an "illegal, unwarranted, fraudulent and useless" investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Shaw was acquitted March 1, 1969, of Garrison's charges that he conspired to assassinate Kennedy.

The suit accused Garrison and others of knowingly soliciting and using perjured testimony in the prosecution of Shaw and of drugging, hypnotizing and bribing witnesses.

Besides Garrison, the suit named as defendants Cecil M. Shilstone, Willard E. Robertson, Joseph M. Rault Jr. and Perry Raymond Russo.

Shilstone, Robertson and Rault are wealthy New Orleans businessmen who headed a group called Truth and Consequences Inc., which was formed to provide financial backing for the Garrison investigation.

Russo was the prosecution's star witness.
