**Assassination  
 site sold 4**

DALLAS (UPI) — The Texas School Book Depository, that infamous red brick building from which President John F. Kennedy was gunned down in 1963, was sold at public auction.

Aubrey Mayhew, 42, of Nashville, Tenn., who claims he owns the largest collection of Kennedy memorabilia in the world, bought the building for \$650,000 yesterday. Asked what his plans were for the building, Mr. Mayhew replied, "None." Asked why he bought it, he said, "It was cheap."

There was more to it than that, of course, and it all came out at a press conference after he signed the contract and put up the \$65,000 deposit. Prior to that Mr. Mayhew refused to answer questions because newsmen were "too disorderly" to suit him.

He said he became interested in preserving Kennedy memorabilia about six months after the assassination because, as he put it, "history was being made and I wanted to preserve some of it."

With the aid of a partner, whom he refused to name, Mr. Mayhew established the John F. Kennedy Memorial Center in Nashville. He said the center would remain in Nashville despite his purchase of the Depository.

The present owner of the building, Col. D. Harold Byrd, reportedly had been offered \$1.5 million for the 67-year-old structure.
