

Why-on a sun-struck November afternoon in Dallas in '63-did an unprepossessing 24-year-old repatriate murder the 35th President of the United States?

Here, in 622 galvanic pages, one of journalism's most respected veterans (former managing editor of *The Reporter*, and foreign correspondent for *Newsweek*) does what the Warren Commission Report and its 26 supporting volumes failed to do satisfactorily.
