BULLETS 4/18/64  
 JOSEFA, WASH. (UPI)—A PATHOLOGIST AT THE UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS  
 BELIEVES THURSDAY LENT TO COURT IN HIS EFFORTS TO OBTAIN  
 BULLETS IN THE JOHN F. KENNEDY ASSASSINATION AND THAT THEY  
 IF THEY WERE FIRED BY THE SAME GUN.  
 THE PATHOLOGIST, DR. JOHN P. NICHOLS, SUED U. S. ARCHIVIST  
 JAMES B. BYRNE AND NAVY SECRETARY JOHN W. CHAFFE FOR THE  
 RIGHT TO EXAMINE THE BULLETS.  
 NICHOLS SAID THE BULLETS OR FRAGMENTS HE WANTS WERE THE ONE  
 WHICH KILLED KENNEDY AND WOUNDED TEXAS GOV. JOHN B. CONNELLEY IN  
 NOVEMBER, 1961, IN DALLAS.  
 THE BULLETS WOULD BE SUBJECTED TO NEUTRON ACTIVATION ANALYSIS  
 IN THE ATOMIC NUCLEAR ACCELERATOR AT THE UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS  
 TO DETERMINE IF "TRACE METALS" IN THE FRAGMENTS MATCH. NICHOLS SAID  
 THE PROCESS WOULD BE CONCLUSIVE.  
 NICHOLS HAS SPENT MUCH OF HIS SPARE TIME DURING THE PAST FIVE  
 YEARS TRYING TO CLEAR UP WHAT HE CALLS "CONFLICTING OPINIONS" CONCERNING  
 THE ASSASSINATION. SURVEILLING THE ASSASSINATION FOR SEVERAL  
 YEARS THAT LAD "WANTED TO KILL KENNEDY" BEFORE HE WAS  
 IN JANUARY HE WAS UNSUCCESSFUL IN A FEDERAL SUIT SEEKING  
 CUSTODY RIGHTS FILED WITH THE U. S. ARCHIVIST BY THE KENNEDY  
 FAMILY.
