Wade sees little chance of new assassination fact

"Illst. Atiy. Henry Wade said Monday he suspects that "someone may have blanted the seed" for Lee Harvey Oswald to assassinate President John F. Kennedy here 13 years ago, but he sees little chance of a congressional committee proving that a conspiracy existed.

Wade said he agreed to turn over office records to the committee's staff for ase in a renewed investigation.

We will cooperate with the commitfee, but I think there is virtually no chance it can come up with hard evidence to show that a conspiracy existed. Wade said.

"To do that, you would need some one who would swear that he was part of the conspiracy. If a conspiracy did exist, I don't think you would have someone come forward now."

• Wade said he agrees with the Warren Commission that Oswald "did all of the shooting" when Kennedy was assassinated as his motorcade moved through Dallas.

"I have always felt that someone may have encouraged him — that someone may have planted the seed — but I am convinced he acted alone," Wade said.

Wade said the encouragement could, have come from members of the "Fair."
Play for Cuba" group since Oswald was closely associated with it.

Wade questioned Oswald at Dallas police headquarters after his arrest in a theater here, but the former Marine refused to answer questions.

refused to answer questions.

"I set up another interview for 2 o'clock on Sunday afternoon," Wade related. "I was hopeful that Oswald might answer questions if we could get him away from all the turmoil which existed at police headquarters, where there were hundreds of reporters and cameramen.

"But, while officers were transfer, ring him to the Dallas County jail, Jack Ruby shot him and I never got the chance to question him again."
