Re telephone call to Dallas from Assistant Director IVAN CONRAD at 5:40 PM, C.S.T., 1/28/64, requesting the movie camera used by ORVILLE O. MIX be obtained and forwarded to the Laboratory.

Enclosed under separate cover is one Keystone Auto Soom, Model K-810, 8-mm movie camera in a black leather carrying case, Keystone No. 702.

MIX advised the camera is presently loaded with a new roll of colored film of the same type with which the pictures of the Presidential Motorcade were taken, which MIX said it would be satisfactory for the Bureau to use as long as the film was replaced. He said the setting was at 40 and he was using the Soom lens with Type A film.

He recalled that the first series were made at the corner of Main and Houston just as the Motorcade turned north on Houston and he was at a position near the curb on the southwest corner of the intersection and made the pictures of the left side of the Presidential car.

After the car got by, he then proceeded to a point about 20 feet west of Houston Street on the south side of Main Street and made the latter series across an open area which was in view of his position, using the goom lens completely open.

As to whether or not the camera was wound tightly, he pointed out that he could not recall specifically, but his

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his experience had been that it would only run at a slow speed when the spring was almost run down.

Mr. MIX advised that the Bureau is welcome to use the camera for experimental purposes and that he would be available as a witness in the event his services were needed in the future.
