Re telephone call to Dallas from Inspector J. R. MALLEY at the Bureau, 8/27/64, with reference to a call from President's Commission representative JAMES WESLEY LIEBRIER regarding a Mexican bus ticket found by MARINA OSVALD among her effects.

F., to Laredo, Texas, which bears a block stamp on the back "Transportes del Morte, Set. 30, 1963, Mexico, D. F., J. Gascon". This date on the block stamp is September 30, 1963.

(2) A pamphlet entitled "This Week - Esta Semana" for the period September 28 to October 4, 1963. This is a tourist guide for this week for the Republic of Mexico.

(3) A book with cover torm off entitled "Learning Russian" by NINA POTAPOVA.

(5) A pemphlet in English entitled Ficeta Brave, published by Pemex Travel Club, Mexico, D. F.

(6) A library pass in the name of LKE MARYEY OSYALD, dated April, 1962, written in the Russian language. This pass was used by OSWALD to obtain books in public libraries in Russia.

(7) Ten copies of a LEN regarding an interview with MARINA OSWALD, 8/27/64, at which time she furnished a Mexican bus ticket stub and other items found by her among her effects as described above.

It is requested the FBI Laboratory examine enclosed evidentiary material for such purpose as may be required by the President's Commission. It is further requested the Laboratory furnish the Dallas Office photographs of this evidentiary material herewith enclosed for completion of the Dallas files.

In this connection, it is noted MARIKA OSTALD stated the Mexican bus ticket stup has been touched by the following persons in the last few days: PRISCILLA JOHNSON, MARINA OSVALD, Mr. DECLAN FORD, Mrs. DECLAN FORD, and Miss SOAN COMMALLY.

The Bureau may desire to submit enclosed Mexico. City map er copy thereof, to Legat, Mexico, for his examination and identification of markings.

It will be observed the enclosed LHM relates that Mr. LIMBELER called MARIKA OSVALD at her home in Richardson, Texas, on the evening of August 26, 1964. MARIKA has said LIMBELER asked her several questions, including: (1) Bid LKK HARVEY OSVALD regularly read assumptions during the OSVALDs' residence at New Orleans; (2) several questions concerning the unemployment checks received by OSVALD; and (3) whether OSVALD went to Mexico the day following MARIKA's departure from New Orleans for Texas, or did he stay in New Orleans and leave on a later date.

It will further be observed that MARINA OSTALD has stated PRISCILLA JOHNSON, writer, who is collaborating with MARINA on a book, is presently the house guest of MARINA.

MARINA further advised that visiting in her home at the time of LIEBELER's call was Niss JOAN CORNALLY, Secretary to WILLIAN MC KENZIE, a Dallas attorney who has performed legal work for MARINA OSVALD. Miss COMMALLY also talked to Mr. LIEBELER concerning a description of the bus ticket stub as above described.
