NEW YORK (AP)—Ten years ago Lee Harvey Oswald was "a small, lonely, withdrawn kid who looked to me like he was heading for trouble," his former probation officer said Monday.

John Carro, the probation officer, said he remembers the accused assassin of President Kennedy as a 13-year-old truant who lived in the Bronx for about 18 months with his mother.

Carro said Oswald was assigned to him from April, 1953 to January, 1954. He said judges, a psychiatrist and social workers agreed that the boy was emotionally disturbed and needed treatment.

"The psychiatrist warned that Oswald had some awful violent feelings inside him—that he couldn't control them if they came to the surface," Carro said.

Oswald was shot down in a Dallas police station eight days ago.

Carro says he remembers that Oswald, 18 years ago a seventh grader, didn't like school or the other pupils because they had laughed at the jeans he wore and his Southern drawl. He said the boy spent most of 18 months in New York watching television while his mother was out working.

Four different judges recommended that Oswald be put in a youth home, Carro recalled. But at the time there were no openings.

Originally, he said, he wrote Oswald's mother to please come in and bring her boy.

"The letter came back: 'Moved. Left no forwarding address,'" Carro said. "And that was the last I heard of Lee Harvey Oswald. Until last week."
