## ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT WARREN COMMISSION FILM

On 8/11/64, Mr. John F. Novatney, Jr., law firm of Baker, Hostetler and Patterson, Union Commerce Building, Cleveland, and Mr. Burt Reinhardt, Managing Editor, United Press International (UPI), Newslilm, 449 West 56th Street, New York 19, New York, called at my office and talked to Kemper.

Mr. Novatney stated that his firm represents UPI and they had been referred to Inspector Malley of the FBI by the Warren Commission in connection with certain films which were owned by UPI. He stated that they desired to put on all copies of these films a film strip which would show that UPI had the copyright to these films. He also wanted the FBI's assurance that we would not distribute them to anyone outside of the FEL.

These toy pieces of film are of the assassination and are known as the Muchmoze film and the Nix film. (It will be recalled that UFI was extremely cooperative right after the assassination in making copies available to us.)

Kemper said that we would be only too glad to put the copyright films on the copies in our possession and Mr. Reinhardt is going to send them down to us so that this will be done.

Kemper assured Mesors. Novatney and Reinhardt that the Bureau would never give the film out to anyone, even in the Federal Government.

Mr. Novatney said he understood that U. S. Information Service is making a film on the assassination and they are going to contact them to be sure they don't have any of the film. He is also going to contact the Secret Service in order to make a similar request of them.
