MURKIN - INFORMATION CONCERNING

Enclosed for Dallas and New York are two copies each of a letter received from the President's Commission dated May 23, 1964, which is self-explanatory.

New York is instructed to contact headquarters in records, 711 Fifth Avenue, New York 22, New York, to determine where the original tape is located which was reported by the Commission. Also obtain information regarding the identity and the address of the announcer; and if not previously interviewed, set out appropriate leads so that he may be contacted relative to any information relating to the assassination. Dallas should contact Columbia Pictures Corp., in Dallas if there is an office located in your city and obtain information regarding this matter as in all probability the work was done directly from this location.

To receive this matter at an early date, all offices are instructed to get out any leads by teletype instructing appropriate letterhead memoranda are to be furnished to the Bureau and inserts to Dallas for incorporation in a subsequent report. Handle promptly.

NOTE:

Request from the Commission dated May 22, 1964, received today at the Bureau, indicated Colpix Records, a division of the Columbia Pictures Corporation produced in association with the United Press International a record entitled, "Four Days that Shocked the World." This record deals with a purported on-the-spot broadcast, from a mobile unit, of the assassination. The Commission heard a record and they believed it may be possible the timing of the gunshots may be detectable. They subsequently requested the original tape recording of broadcast at the assassination scene be obtained. Also they desired the identity and address of the announcer and the determination of his location at the time of the broadcast.
