## September 29, 1975

On Saturday, September 20, 1975, Alan H. Belmont was interviewed at his residence, 240 Chatham Way, Mountain View, California. He was told that the Director of the FBI had made a press release indicating that there were allegations that Lee Harvey Oswald called at the Dallas Office some five days prior to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy and had left a threatening note at the Dallas Office.

Mr. Belmont indicated that he was completely familiar with these allegations, having read about them in the press. He was asked whether or not he had any knowledge of such a note having been left by Oswald at the Dallas Office. Mr. Belmont stated that he had no information whatsoever concerning such a note. He further advised that he had testified before the Warren Commission regarding the FBI's investigation of the John F. Kennedy assassination, and in preparing himself for this testimony, he completely reviewed the results of all the Bureau's investigation. He stated that he was certain that if there was any information regarding such at note at FBI Headquarters, he would have known about it prior to his testimony before the Warren Commission.
