At times of stress, individuals are quick to find fault. More often than not they speak without any knowledge of the facts. Unfortunately the telegram of November 22, 1963, from you and Mr. Marks indicates unfamiliarity with our jurisdiction.

At this time in the Nation's bereavement, I am disturbed by your implied accusation of negligence 🐬 and feel it necessary to inform you that the protection of the President and his immediate family is the responsibility of the Secret Service of the United States Treasury Department and not the FBL. Secret Service Agents were with the President at the time he was assassinated, and they, as any reasonable person would realize, are particularly grieved over this tragedy and need support rather than criticism during this trying time.
