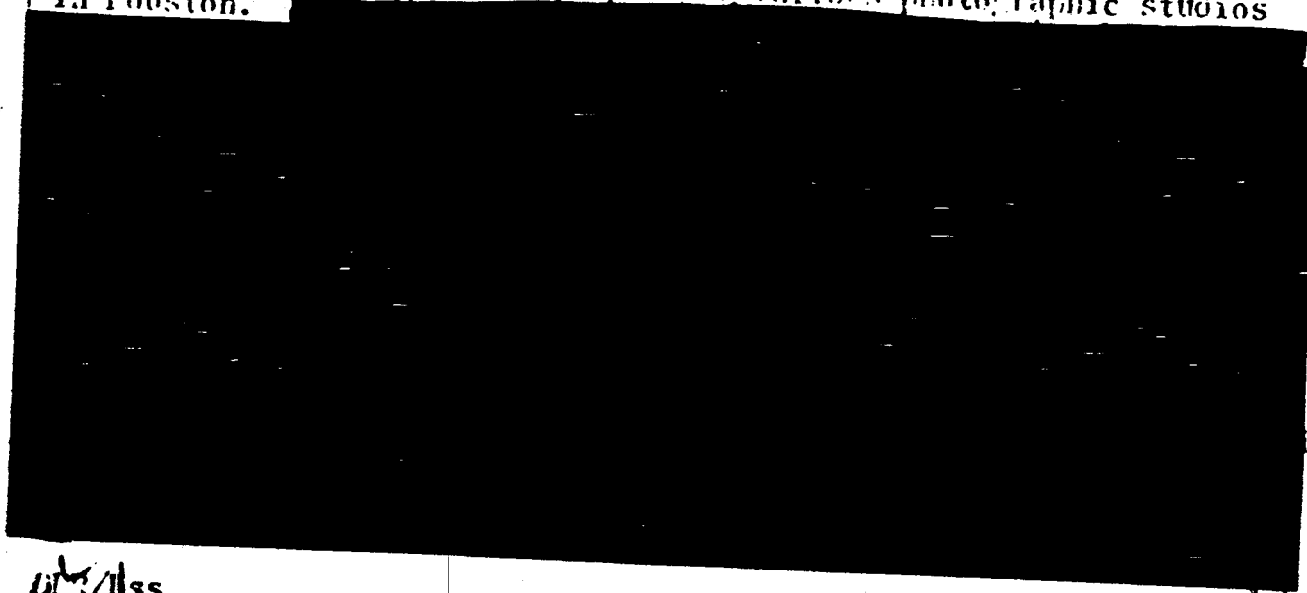

SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

Reference is made to your memorandum to Mr. Tolson dated November 25, 1963, which concerned a conversation overheard between a party in Columbus, Ohio, and a party in Houston, Texas, wherein it was stated concerning the Oswald murder, "It is good they got him before they tied him up with us." Involved in this conversation were Jack Layton, a photographer, 4326 Betty Street, Bellaire, Texas, (a suburb of Houston); Eugene Alphonsus O'Doherty, 1167 South High Street, Columbus, Ohio; and his brother, Vincent Joseph O'Doherty. You requested that Bureau files be reviewed concerning the afore-mentioned.

No identifiable information was located concerning either of the O'Dohertys.

Jack Layton may be identical with Jack Nicholas Layton, born August 30, 1918, Joplin, Missouri, which individual, for several years prior to 1960, operated various photographic studios in Houston.

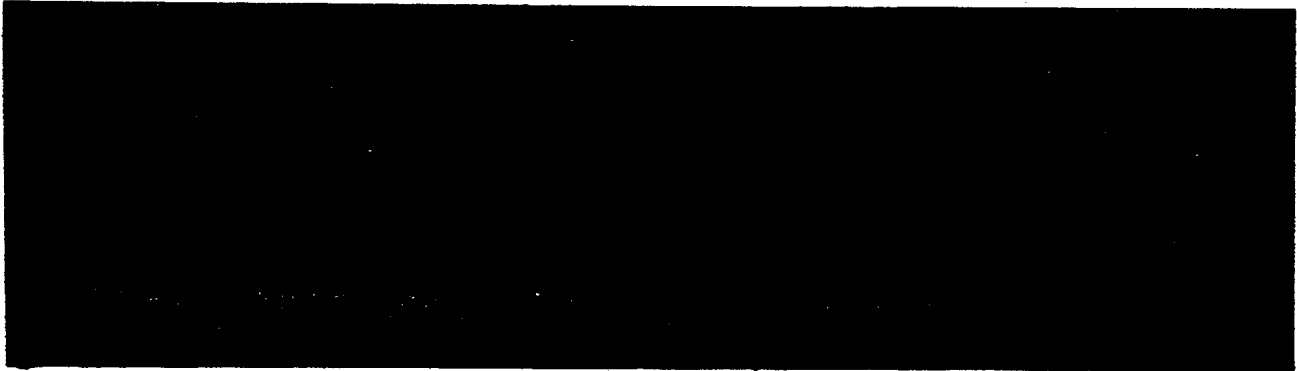
