At 12:15 a.m. on November 24, 1963, Lieutenant Junior Grade A. D. Pelloni, Code 11, 55560, Office of Naval Intelligence, Washington, D. C., called and furnished the following information:

Polloni had just received a telephone call from Lieutenant Colonel Hansen (first name unknown), Duty Officer, U. S. Marine Corps, Washington, D. C. Hansen told Pelloni that he had with him a warrant officer by the name of Gustin who told Hansen he had just received a call from a former U. S. Marine Sergeant calling from Corpus Christi, Texas, and that his name is Felix Cox. Cox reportedly told Gustin as follows:

"When all free world leaders have assembled in one place Monday, there would be a follow-up as in Dallas."

He also said "the particular target would be former President Eisenhower."

The above information was telephonically furnished to Special Agent E. C. Lawrence, Duty Officer, Secret Service (Code 1210. Mr. Bauck's office) at 12:25 a.m., November 24,1933.

Based on available information, a search of Bureau files show no data identifiable with Felix Cox.
