SUBJECT EDWARD DAVY INFORMATION CONCERNING

At 12:15 p.m., 11/29/63, Edward Davy, 1052 Flatbush Avenue, Brooklyn, New York City, telephone number Buckminister 2-7830, called the Bureau and spoke to extra duty agent Richard B. Lavin.

Davy who had obviously been drinking due to his incoherent talk advised that he had some thoughts about the assassination of President <u>Thin F.</u> Kennedy which he wanted brought to the attention of the FBI. He commented that he agreed with an article by Robert Considine which appeared in the New York Journal American that the marksmanship in the killing of President Kennedy was phenomenal. Davy stated that he could not have been killed by a rifle but it must have been someone close to the President on the ground who did the shooting.

He had no concrete basis upon which to base this thought except his opinion.
