New Jersey, telephone number MI 3-6300, telephonically advised
that he was telephoned today by an acquaintance, [REDACTED]
an employee of the Bell Telephone Company, Waverly Business
Office, Newark, New Jersey, telephone number BI 8-7043, advising
him that [REDACTED] Miss (first name unknown) Brycelan,
was telephonically contacted by one Bert Karese Boom, 20 Hazel
Place, Newark, New Jersey. Boom was allegedly complaining to
Miss Brycelan about annoying telephone calls he has been
receiving for the past six months. He is alleged to have said,
"I would like to kill all Niggers and if I had my way, I would
kill the President too." He is also alleged to have said,
"I am glad the President is dead."

According to [REDACTED] he was called for advice
by [REDACTED] as a result of Miss Brycelan becoming upset by
statements made by Mr. Boom.
