ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN F. KENNEDY, NOVEMBER 22, 1963

DALSIE COBE, 1414 Iturbide, Laredo, Texas,
advised on November 22, 1963, that Mr. and Mrs. JAMES
GARRETT, residents in apartment at 1414 Iturbide, had LAREDO, TEXAS
resided there for approximately thirteen months. GARRETT
has in the past become very violent in his political MEXICO
discussions concerning President KENNEDY, and has stated
that if he had the chance he would kill President KENNEDY
and wished that Hitler had killed all the Jews. COBE
advised that GARRETT left Laredo November 20, 1963,
without notice. She stated that for the two or three-
day period previous to his departure he had become very
nervous and had watched his mail closely.

MARIO ROMERO LOPETEGUI, Mexican Consul General,
Laredo, advised that no tourist immigrant or nonimmigrant TEXAS
visas were issued to JAMES GARRETT within the last five MEXICO
months.

Mrs. GARRETT advises that Mr. GARRETT is
presently visiting friends at Monterrey, Mexico, and is
due to return Tuesday, November 26, 1963. Mrs. GARRETT
denies that Mr. GARRETT has become violent in his political
discussions, stating that he is a Republican and naturally
differs politically with KENNEDY. She states that he is
a person of "calm character" and not capable of violence.
