Re: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT  
JOHN F. KENNEDY, NOVEMBER 22,  
1963, DALLAS, TEXAS

On November 23, 1963, Detective Sergeant ED POST, West Palm Beach, Florida, Police Department, advised that FRANK WITTY, newspaper reporter, "Palm Beach Times," West Palm Beach, Florida, brought in a post card addressed to "The Palm Beach Times, West Palm Beach, Florida." The card is postmarked "Riviera Beach, Florida, November 23, 1963, 8:00 p.m." The card bore the message, "Mission fulfilled. Rest of KENNEDYs next."

POST advised the card was handprinted and had a lefthand slant in an obvious attempt to disguise the handwriting. He stated in his opinion, the card was from a "crank."

POST advised he had determined the card had been handled by an undeterminable group of people at the paper before being turned over to him. He stated the card would be made available to the Federal Bureau of Investigation on request.

On November 24, 1963, Chief of Police JOHN ALCE, Riviera Beach, Florida, Police Department, was contacted regarding the post card. He advised he had no suspects in the matter, and could furnish no pertinent information at this time.

On November 24, 1963, Mrs. VIRGINIA THACKER, Sunday Supervisor, United States Post Office, Riviera Beach, Florida, advised she had no suspects in this matter, and to her knowledge, there has been no such similar incident happen previously.
