Also enclosed are nine pages, being Xerox copies, of employment reports made out by OSWALD in connection with his duties while employed by William B. Reily and Co., Inc. The initials and date "AGV, 11/23/63" and name "E. C. Barbe, Jr." were not OSWALD, nor was the notation "back of Thursday 7-11", written at the top of one page, and the wording "back of 12th" at the top of another page.

Handwriting and hand printing on all of the above specimens should be compared with any questioned handwriting and hand printing in this case.

Also enclosed are five copies of "The American Rifleman", being issues of June, 1963; July, 1963; September, 1963; October, 1963; and November, 1963.

Also enclosed is one copy of magazine "Guns and Bunting", issue of January, 1964, and magazine "Field and Stream", issue of December, 1958.

It is to be noted that an order blank has been torn from the bottom of Page 59 of the June, 1963, issue of "The American Rifleman". This appears to be torn from a page advertising guns offered for sale by "Klein's", a sporting goods company of Chicago, Illinois.

It should be noted that the above magazines werefurnished by ADRIAN T. ALBA, owner-operator, The Crescent
City Garage, 618 Magazine Street, which is located adjacent
to William B. Reily and Co., Inc., where OSWALD was employed
from May 10, 1963, to July 19, 1963. OSWALD is said to have
been intensly interested in the gun magazines maintained at
this garage by Mr. ALBA, a gun collector. Mr. ALBA states
OSWALD borrowed one of the magazines and returned it but is
unable to state which magazine or either the date same was
borrowed.

These magazines should be examined for any fingerprints of suspect OSWALD and any other suspect developed in
this case. On the torn page, check should be made under this
torn page for any indented writing.

If the FBI Laboratory is in possession of any order form forwarded Klein's Sporting Goods Company, an examination and comparison should be made to determine whether such order form was torn from this magazine which may have been borrowed by OSWALD.

If such application blank has not been forwarded the FBI Laboratory, the Dallas Division should consider requesting such order form be obtained and forwarded the FBI Laboratory for comparison with this magazine.

Also enclosed is a photograph of an envelope postmarked June 8, 1963, New Orleans, Louisiana, addressed to The Worker, 23 West 26th Street, New York 10, New York, bearing return address Post Office Box 30061, New Orleans, La.

Also enclosed are photographs of two-page letter addressed to The Worker from L. H. OSWALD, Post Office Box 30061, New Orleans, La.

The above photographs were obtained from New Orleans file regarding OSWALD and were originally furnished to New York Office on June 26, 1963, by

Also enclosed is Post Office Change of Address card addressed to "The Worker", postmarked New Orleans, giving change of address for LEE H. OSWALD from 4907 Magazine Street, New Orleans, La., to Post Office Box 30061, New Orleans, La., effective June 15. This card also obtained from OSWALD's file in New Orleans and was originally made available to New York Office by The Company of July 8, 1963.

Also enclosed is a library card for OSWALD which was prepared by him, with the exception of the information contained at the top of the card, the word "Orleans" and the writing in the lower right hand corner.

Handwriting and hand printing on these above specimens should also be compared with any questioned handwriting and hand printing in this case.
