**UNKNOWN SUBJECTS  
5645 MISSION BOULEVARD  
RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA**

On November 25, 1963, Robert and Philipina Codd, 6353 Mission Boulevard, Riverside, California, furnished the following information to a Special Agent of the FBI:

At approximately 11:00 p.m., on November 24, 1963, two men entered the coffee shop at the Rubidoux, 5645 Mission Boulevard, Riverside, California. After consuming some food and beverages, they left shortly before midnight on November 24, 1963. Barbara Albrecht, a waitress at this coffee shop, found a note on their table stating words to the effect that "Johnson should beware Black Monday." Albrecht retained the note.

On November 25, 1963, Barbara Albrecht, 4095 Rees Street, Riverside, California, furnished the following information to Special Agents of the FBI:

On November 24, 1963, at approximately 11:00 p.m., an individual of Mexican appearance entered the coffee shop of the Rubidoux Bowl, Riverside, California, and sat down at a table. A few minutes later he was joined by a Latin appearing individual. Both of these men ordered pie and coffee, which was served by Barbara Albrecht. They consumed the pie and coffee and carried on a general conversation during the period 11:00 p.m. to approximately 11:30 p.m., when they left the coffee shop. After the men left, Barbara Albrecht recovered a paper napkin with the following written and printed on it:

"Johnson 'it' has been decreed by special authority that Monday shall go down in history as 'Black Monday'! Thus beware of the wrath of the 'Black Monday.'"

Barbara Albrecht noticed that the Latin appearing man prepared the note.

Barbara Albrecht described the individuals as follows:

**Mexican appearing male:**

Age:	21 - 22
Weight:	120 pounds
Complexion:	Dark
Hair:	Dark
Accent:	None
Dress:	Neatly dressed in slacks and a sweater

**Latin appearing male:**

Complexion:	Dark
Hair:	Black
Eyes:	Brown, wore glasses
Height:	5' 8" - 5' 10"
Dress:	Neatly dressed in slacks and a sweater

Neither Barbara Albrecht nor Philipina Codd, who also is employed at the coffee shop, Rubidoux Bowl, could recall having ever seen the two individuals before. They could furnish no additional information concerning their identity.

Fred Maurer, a dishwasher, and Don Atwood, a bartender at the Rubidoux, were also interviewed and could furnish no information as to the identity of these persons.
