Dear Mr. Hoover:

I am finding it most difficult to understand the circumstances in Dallas, Texas, which brought about the assassination of the late President, John F. Kennedy. Likewise, the shooting of the assassin, Lee Hervey Oswald, by Jack Rubinstein, alias Jack Ruby. It is my belief, in both cases, that the Dallas Police Department followed a pattern of irresponsibility and should be severely condemned. Not only was the life of President Kennedy lost, but the "key," Lee Harvey Oswald, was also destroyed.

In a layman's analysis of the Dallas tragedy, and the subsequent fiasco in the Dallas City Jail, I am convinced that Lee Harvey Oswald acted under orders. With his usefulness now at an end, it became the responsibility of Jack Rubinstein to seal Oswald's lips forever. My great hope is that your organization may be able to ferret out and bring to justice those responsible for the plot.

Tomorrow afternoon I meet my class in Political Science at Hartnell College here in Salinas. I wish that it were possible for you to be my guest speaker and explain, from your many years of experience, the dangers of communism.
