-- At 3:03 a.m., 12/4/63, Quentin Bare, Panther, West Virginia, telephonically contacted Midnight supervisor William E. Asmus regarding the captioned matter.

Bare advised him he was intoxicated and in a argumentative mood. He stated that, as a marksmen, he knew it was impossible to fire three shots from a bolt-action rifle in five seconds, and wanted to know what the FBI's investigation had proved. He was informed that details of the FBI's investigation could not be released as such information was confidential.

The telephone conversation was terminated when another call was received by supervisor Asmus.

Supervisor Asmus was negative concerning Bare.
