The purpose of this memorandum is to set forth

background details for the record concerning the false report received from Mrs. Margaret Kathryn Hoover, 100 South Walnut Street, Martinsburg, Pennsylvania, concerning the captioned matter.

On November 28, 1963, Mrs. Hoover advised Special Agents of the Pittsburgh Division that during the third week of October, 1963, she found a used ticket of the Seaboard Airline Railroad Company. This ticket represented travel from Miami, Florida, to Washington, D. C., on September 25, 1963. [Krs. Hoover] also indicated that at the same time she found the railroad ticket in her front yard, she also found an advertisement bearing the notations on the back, which was otherwise blank, of the name of an unrecalled club and a six-digit number located in the upper left hand corner, and the name Rubenstein, Lee Oswald, Jack Ruby and Dallas, Texas, located in the upper right hand corner of the page. Mrs. Hoover made available the unused portion of the train ticket and the envelope to go with it. She was unable to locate the advertisement bearing the alleged information concerning Rubenstein, Lee Oswald, and so forth. Mrs. Hoover stated that since the finding of the papers occurred at the approximate time a new neighbor, Doctor Julio C. Fernandez, had moved into a residence located at 400 East Allegheny Street, Martinsburg, which is within fifty feet of Mrs. Hoover's residence, she felt that this undoubtedly came from the Fernandez family, who reportedly has associates in Florida.

It is to be noted that Hrs. Margaret Kay Kauffman, 600 East Allegheny, Martinsburg, Pennsylvania, who is the daughter of Hrs. Hoover, verified the statements given by her mother.

feeling and further identified the railroad ticket in question as that of his son, who had traveled from Florida to Washington, D. C., during September, 1963. Following an extensive interview of Fernandez, Mrs. Hoover was reinterviewed, and she continued to reiterate her earlier story. However, upon reinterview of the daughter, Mrs. Kauffman and Mr. Kauffman, both acknowledged that Mrs. Hoever has become and had imagined the entire story concerning Rubenstein and Oswald notations. Mrs. Kauffman has been under her mother's influence and has been taking tranquilizers for an extended period of time. Both Mr. and Mrs. Kauffman said that Mrs. Hoover made up the story given to the FBI in order to have the Fernandez family evicted from their home.

This matter was presented for an opinion and AUSA R. E. Tucker, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, declined prosecutive action in view of the involved.
