Assassination of President
John F. Kennedy

On the evening of 11/22/63, Mr. William Taylor, United States Commission on Civil Rights, advised the Liaison Agent of the following.

Mrs. Merlin Meyers, wife of the local representative of the American Friends Service Committee, has since Wednesday, 11/20/63, been receiving threatening telephone calls from an unidentified person. Shortly after the announcement of the President's assassination, Mrs. Meyers received a telephone call from an unidentified person whose voice appeared to be identical to previous unidentified callers. The person advised Mrs. Meyers that "We got the President and now we are going to get you."

In addition to the above, a cross was burned at the residence of Mrs. Meyers on the evening of 11/21/63. According to Taylor, the above information has been referred to the Montgomery County Police Department and Detective Sergeant Day of the Montgomery County Police is handling the case.

Taylor advised that he was not making any request of the Bureau and was furnishing this to us for our information and for any use we might consider appropriate.

This matter was discussed with Supervisor Rogge of the General Investigative Division. Rogge instructed that above information be furnished to our Resident Agent in Silver Spring, Maryland, for appropriate handling. In accordance with Rogge's request, the Liaison Agent telephonically contacted SA Charles M. Fleury of the Silver Spring, Maryland, Resident Agency and advised him of the above facts. Fleury was instructed to promptly obtain all the facts in this matter and advise the Bureau of the results.
