COMMUNIET PARTY, USA PANPHLETS AND PUBLICATIONS IS - C

ASSABCINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F.

A source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that at a meeting of Communist Party members held in Newark, New Jersey, on November 22, 1968, James Lustig, New Jersey State Communist Party (CP) Chairman, stated that the CP, USA had decided to put out a special edition of "The Worker" setting forth the facts of President Kennedy's ABFRSSINGTION. According to this source, this edition would also carry the CP's analysis of the situation and developments within the United States which culminated in the President's death.

According to the source, it was also stated that in this regard use would be made of press interview of a Supreme Court Justice who, according to one of the party members present, had stated the assassination apparently stemmed from built up hatred over the integration question and disatisfaction with the Cuban situation. The source stated he was unable to determine which Supreme Court Justice had made this interview.

The source went on to state that Lustig as well as others present felt the assassination resulted from a tense atmosphere created by Birchites.
