ONE DASH WINSTON B. LINMAN, SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA, ADVISED
HE CONTACTED THE MEXICAN CONSULATE, NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA,
SEPTEMBER SEVENTEEN LAST AND OBTAINED MEXICAN TOURIST
CARDS FOR HIMSELF, HIS BROTHER, HENRY E. LINMAN, JR.,
KEN DEAS, AND GORDON A. YAMM. WINSTON B. LINMAN ADVISED
HE WAS THE ONLY ONE OF THIS GROUP WHO WENT TO THE MEXICAN
CONSULATE IN NEW ORLEANS ON THIS DATE.

WINSTON B. LINMAN STATED IT IS QUITE POSSIBLE HE MADE A MISTAKE AND PLACED HIS FATHER-S NAME, HENRY EDWARD LINMAN ON ONE OF TOURIST CARD APPLICATIONS HE OBTAINED IN MEXICAN CONSULATE. *ha.*

WINSTON B. LINMAN STATED HE DOES NOT RECALL SEEING ANY OTHER PERSON IN THE MEXICAN CONSULATE AT THE TIME HE OBTAINED THE TOURIST CARD, EXCEPT PERSONS WHO APPEARED TO BE OF MEXICAN EXTRACTION. HE STATED THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING THESE CARDS WAS TO HUNT DUCKS AT MATAMOROS, MEXICO, AND THAT HE, HENRY E. LINMAN, JR., DEAS HAY, AND SIX OTHER MEN FLEW TO BROWNSVILLE, TEXAS, FROM SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA, ON TWO PLANES ON SEPTEMBER TWENTY SIXTYTHREE AFTER WHICH THEY DROVE TO MATAMOROS. THEY HUNTED DUCKS ON SEPTEMBER TWENTYFIRST AND TWENTY SECOND NEAR MATAMOROS AND NONE OF THE MEN HAD ANY INFORMATION CONCERNING LEE HENRY OSWALD. TWO DASH SAMUEL THOMAS WORTH, JR. OF NEW ORLEANS OBTAINED MEXICAN TOURIST PERMITS ON SEPTEMBER SEVENTEEN SIXTYTHREE

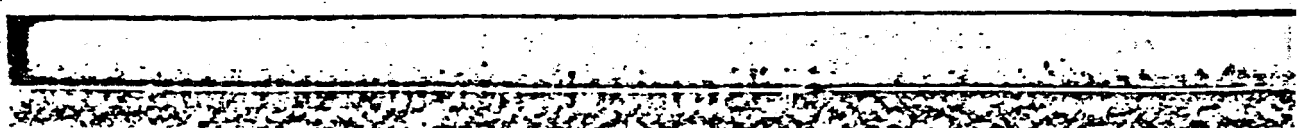

AT THE MEXICAN CONSULATE IN NEW ORLEANS FOR BOTH HIMSELF *has* AND HIS FIANCEE, JUDITH MARIE, IN NAME OF MRS. JUDITH MARIE NORTH, AT ABOUT NINE FORTYFIVE A. M., SEPTEMBER SEVENTEEN SIXTYTHREE. NORTH ADVISED MISS MUTH, WHOM HE MARRIED ON SEPTEMBER TWENTYONE SIXTYTHREE, DID NOT ACCOMPANY HIM TO THE MEXICAN CONSULATE.

NORTH ADVISED HE WAS NOT ACQUAINTED AND DID NOT RECALL SEEING ANYONE RESEMBLING LEE HARVEY OSWALD AT THE CONSULATE WHEN NORTH OBTAINED THE TWO TOURIST PERMITS. NORTH ADVISED AFTER HE MARRIED MISS MUTH, THEY TRAVELED TO MEXICO VIA AUTOMOBILE AND STAYED AT THE AMBASSADOR, MONTERREY, MEXICO, UNTIL SEPTEMBER TWENTYFOUR SIXTYTHREE, WHEN THEY RE-ENTERED REYNOSA, TEXAS.

WILLIAM GEORGE GAUDET, WAVELAND, MISS., ADVISED TO BEST OF HIS RECOLLECTION IN EARLY AFTERNOON, SEPT. SEVENTEEN, SIXTYTWO, HE PICKED UP TRAVEL PERMIT FROM MEXICAN CONSULATE. STATED THERE WERE SIX OR SEVEN PERSONS WAITING TO PICK UP PERMITS AND TO BEST OF RECOLLECTION, LEE HARVEY OSWALD WAS NOT ONE OF THEM. GAUDET STATED LEFT NEW ORLEANS SEPT. NINETEEN VIA PAN AMERICAN AIRLINES AT TWELVE NOON. POSITIVE LEE HARVEY OSWALD WAS NOT ONE OF FLIGHT PASSENGERS IN FIRST CLASS SECTION.

DAVID PEARCE MAGYAR, CHIEF PILOT, TRANS GULF SEAPLANE SERVICE, INC., NEW ORLEANS, LA., STATED CONTACTED MEXICAN TOURIST BUREAU, NEW ORLEANS, SEPT. SIXTYTHREE/RECORDS, MEXICAN TOURIST BUREAU INDICATE MAGYAR IN CONSULATE SEPT. SEVENTEEN./ MAGYAR ADVISED NO ONE PRESENT IN CONSULATE AT TIME OF ISSUANCE OF VISA ABOUT TWO THIRTY PM. MAGYAR ADVISED DEPARTED NEW ORLEANS BY SEAPLANE SEPT. TWENTYFOUR FOR MEXICO, RETURNING SEPT. THIRTY. HAS NO INFO AND DID NOT OBSERVE OR SEE LEE HARVEY OSWALD AT ANY TIME DURING THIS PERIOD OR SINCE THEN.

M. + Mrs. GEORGE HENRY DE MEN AND FLORENCE PARSON DE MEN, HUSBAND AND MEX
WIFE, SEVEN TWO ZERO NINE FRISCOVILLE AVE., ARABI, LA., ADVISED ON
NOVEMBER TWENTYSEVEN SIXTYTHREE, THAT THEY APPLIED IN PERSON ON
SEPTEMBER SEVENTEEN SIXTYTHREE, AT THE MEXICAN CONSULATE IN NEW
ORLEANS, LA., FOR PERMITS TO VISIT MEXICO AS TOURISTS.

MR. AND MRS. DE MEN STATED THAT THEY CANNOT RECALL SEEING
LEE HARVEY OSWALD AT THE TIME THEY APPLIED FOR THEIR PERMITS OR
AT ANY TIME ON THEIR TRIP TO MONTERREY, MEXICO AND THEIR RETURN
TO LA. THEY TRAVELED IN THEIR PERSONALLY OWNED AUTO IN THE COMPANY
OF MR. AND MRS. MELVIN PLUCHE, SEVEN TWO TWO ONE FRISCOVILLE, } MEX
ARABI, LA., WHO HAD APPLIED FOR THEIR TRAVEL PERMITS PRIOR TO
SEPTEMBER SEVENTEEN SIXTYTHREE.

THE DE MENS STATED THAT THEIR TRIP CONSISTED ENTIRELY OF
SIGHTSEEING IN ABOUT A SIXTY MILE PADIUS OF MONTERREY, MEXICO,
AND AT NO TIME DID THEY MEET OR OBSERVE OSWALD. THEY LEFT LA. ON
SEPTEMBER TWENTYTWO SIXTYTHREE, AND ARRIVED IN MONTERREY ON THE
EVENING OF SEPTEMBER TWENTYTHREE. THEY RETURNED TO THE UNITED
STATES ON SEPTEMBER TWENTYFIVE SIXTYTHREE.

JESSE JAMES GARNER, FORTYNINE ELEVEN MAGAZINE ST., NEW

ORLEANS, ADVISED HE SAW OSWALD ON SEPTEMBER SIXTEEN

LAST AND ASKED HIM FOR THE RENT WHICH WAS DUE ON SEPTEMBER

NINE. OSWALD SAID THAT HIS WIFE WAS GOING TO HAVE A BABY
AND THAT HE NEEDED TO KEEP A FEW DOLLARS FOR EMERGENCIES.

ON WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER EIGHTEEN, GARNER BELIEVES HE SAW
OSWALD SITTING ON HIS PORCH READING, BUT HE CANNOT POSITIVELY
AFFIRM THIS.

ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER NINETEEN, AND FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER
TWENTY, GARNER DID NOT WORK AND REMAINED AT THE APARTMENT CUTTING
GRASS ON BOTH DAYS. GARNER STATED THE WOMAN FROM TEXAS PAREN
MRS MICHAEL B. FAINE OF IRVING, TEXAS, ^{La.} PAREN, WAS STAYING WITH THE
OSWALDS ON THESE DATES, AND AT ONE TIME TOLD HIM THAT SHE HAD VISITED
THE FRENCH QUARTER ON A WALKING TOUR ON THE PREVIOUS DAY. GARNER
OBSERVED OSWALD IN HIS APARTMENT ON BOTH OF THESE DATES.

ON SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER TWENTYONE, GARNER WENT TO WORK
AND DID NOT SEE OSWALD UNTIL THAT EVENING WHEN OSWALD BEGAN
LOADING SOME PERSONAL EFFECTS IN THE STATION WAGON. ON

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER TWENTYTWO, OSWALD COMPLETED PACKING THE
STATION WAGON AND WAS TYING DOWN A BABY/S STROLLER ON THE

BACK OF THE STATION WAGON WHEN GARNER APPROACHED HIM AND AGAIN ASKED HIM FOR THE RENT. OSWALD SAID HIS WIFE WAS GOING TO TEXAS FOR HER CONFINEMENT AND THAT HE, OSWALD, WOULD REMAIN IN NEW ORLEANS. HE PROMISED TO PAY HIS RENT AT A LATER DATE.

MRS. JESSE JAMES GARDNER, FOUR NINE ONE ONE MAGAZINE STREET, RESIDENT MANAGER OF APARTMENT, COULD NOT STATE THAT SHE HAD SEEN OSWALD ON SEPTEMBER EIGHTEEN LAST.

ERIC ROGERS, FOUR NINE NAUGHT SEVEN MAGAZINE STREET, *New Orleans* BELIEVES HE SAW OSWALD ON DAILY BASIS BUT COULD NOT SPECIFICALLY PLACE HIM IN NEW ORLEANS ON SEPTEMBER EIGHTEEN SIXTYTHREE.

OTHER NEIGHBORS ALTHOUGH THEY OBSERVED OSWALD PERIODICALLY CANNOT DEFINIEELY STATE HE WAS AT RESIDENCE ON SEPTEMBER EIGHTEEN.

LIBRARY RECORDS.

RECORDS NAPOLEON AVENUE BRANCH, NEW ORLEANS PUBLIC LIBRARY, SHOW TWO BOOKS CHARGED TO LIBRARY CARD NUMBER N EIGHT SIX FOUR ZERO, WHICH IS LIBRARY CARD OF OSWALD. RETURN DATE ON THESE

BOOKS SHOWN AS OCTOBER THREE, SIXTYTHREE. LIBRARIAN ADVISED
THAT BOOKS ARE RETURNABLE FIFTEEN DAYS FROM DATE OF CHARGE OUT,
AND THAT RETURN DATE IS STAMPED ON THE CARD. THIS WOULD
INDICATE THAT THESE BOOKS WHICH WERE DUE TO BE RETURNED ON
OCTOBER THREE, WERE CHARGED OUT ON SEPTEMBER NINETEEN.
