Dear Sir:

First, I would like it to be understood that I am not a Communist, neither do I approve of Castro, Oswald, or anything that is against the Government of The United States.

Enclosed please find a clipping from a local newspaper (The Charleston Evening Post) in which I have underscored a portion of the third paragraph, for which most likely one of your agents is responsible.

President Johnson said the public should and will know all the facts. Unless you have reasons, not stated in this clipping for not permitting Mrs. Oswald, his Mother and Brother, viewing the body before arriving at the cemetery, I think your agent acted wrong.

Unless the family could be held responsible for Oswald's actions, which I doubt, and this was done out of inconsideration by your top agent in Dallas, I trust in the years to come this will weigh heavily on his conscience.

If this was done for reasons not stated I apologize for this letter.
