ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY Mr. Rosen's attached memorandum of 11/29/63 furnished details of the assassination as reported by Agents of the Baltimore Office who had interviewed Secret Service personnel upon their return from Dallas, Texas. One statement in their report quotes Secret Service agent Roy Kellerman as stating that the President's automobile could be covered with a bulletproof "bubble" although this is not used often and was not used on the occasion of the assassination. The Director inquired whether this statement reserves assassination. The Director inquired whether this statement was correct. Kellerman, who has advised that he did not intend to convey the thought that the plastic bubble which is used to protect the occupants of the car from inclement weather was actually bullet proof. There has been some speculation as to whether this plastic might serve to deflect bullets fired at certain angles; however, it is not bullet proof. Kellerman stated he is glad we checked with him on this point and, while he cannot recall the exact words that he used, he regrots that any misunderstanding occurred.
