December 2, 1963 LEE HARVEY OSWALD SUBJECT: IS-3 (ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY) Supervisor Warren Marchessault, NYO, called at 5:05 PM to day to advise that John Abt, attorney for the Communist Party, had contacted the New York Office to advise that Arnold Johnson (Legislative Secretary of the Communist Party) who is his client, had 10cated copies of correspondence Johnson had sent to Oswald. Abt stated that Johnson wanted to make these copies available to the FBI if we wanted them. Abt also advised that in addition, Johnson had received a letter today (12-2) from Oswald which was dated 11-1-63 and which he also wants to make available. Abt said that he would be tied up until 3 PH on 12-3, but that he would be glad to make them available at his office at 3 PM on 12-3-63. while we have copies of some letters sent by Johnson to Cswald, it is believed that the Bureau should accept these letters, Supervisor Marchessault was advised that unless advised to the contrary, New York should accept these letters from Abt, make no comment other than to thank him for the letters, determine if us wanted them returned and, if necessary, sign a receipt for them.
