ANONYMOUS COMMUNICATION CONCERNING ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

The Criminal Division of the Department by letter dated December 4, 1963, forwarded an undated communication postmarked November 29, 1963, at Joliet, Illinois, and signed Pack 15," which had been addressed to the Attorney General and commented on the assassination of the President and the fact that a group of individuals had dedicated themselves to assist the Attorney General in avenging his brother's death by taking independent action against the criminal "syndicate" who hide behind legitimate business fronts outside of the reach of the law.

In an effort to identify the writer we have conducted laboratory analysis of the document along with a latent fingerprint examination. Three latents of value have been obtained. Furthermore, inquiry was made in the Joliet, Illinois, area through all logical sources including the police and sheriff's offices, state police, Post Office and the Boy and Girl Scouts of America. None of these inquiries were productive.
