At the request of members of your staff the FBI Laboratory has made a further study of the film speed of the camora used by Mr. Abraham Zapruder in filming the eight mil-limeter motion picture of the President's assassination. You have previously been furnished the results of the Laboratory examination of this camera which places the film speed at the 18 1/3 frames per second. The Laboratory was requested to a establish, if possible, the variation between the film speed of the comera when the drive spring is fully wound and when the spring is almost run down.

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This study has been made by checking the film speed of the Zaprudor caners at ten second intervals throughout the full running time of a fully wound camera. Several checks were made-on a full toll of film and it was found that the film speed of the concra when fully wound runs at an average speed of from 18.0 to 13.1 frames per second (fps) for the first ten seconds. It gradually increases to 18.3 to 18.5 fps or the next twenty seconds, then gradually decreases slightly ~3 o 1º.1 fps for ten seconds before the final twenty seconds my "1 R してしているいい hat run at an average speed of 17.6 to 17.9 frames per second.
