> ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY RE: INFORMATION FURNISHED BY THOMAS EDWARD TENNANT, INMATE, PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY JAIL, UPPER MARLBORO, MARYLAND

Allegations were made by THOMAS EDWARD TENNANT to the effect that he had, during August to October 1963, resided with GEORGE MC NALLEY and his wife PLOY in Las Cruces, New Mexico, after MO NALLEY had picked him up at a service station while he was hitchhiking. TENNANT, who is currently awaiting a jury trial on charges of Grand Larceny and Breaking and Entering in Prince George's County, Maryland, advised that he had once heard MC NALLEY state while discussing President Kennedy, "I'll kill that guy," and that PLOY stated, "Somebody ought to kill him, giving everything to the Negroes." TENNANT indicated that in view of dreams he has recently had, he feels that President Kennedy may have been Killed by MC NALLEY and a white male named "RICARDO" (last name unknown), who used to go to Mexico with MC NALLEY.

Investigation at Las Cruces, New Mexico, developed that HOWARD WILLIAM FISHER, FBI Number 4893948, and RICHARD ALFRED MC GUIGAN, FBI Number 344421B, inmates at the New Mexico State Popitentiary, were the individuals referred to by TENNANT as GEORGE MC NALLEY and "RICARDO." It was further determined that RICHARD AGETO MC GUIGAN was well known to TENNANT and that MC GUIGAN has known TENNANT since TENNANT was a small baby in Washington, D.C. MC GUIGAN indicated that TENNANT well knew what his name was and stated that only a few members of his family and THOMAS TENNANT had ever called him "RICARDO." Further interview with FISHER and MC GUIGAN developed that neither were

familiar with the conversation concerning the killing of the President mentioned by TENNANT, and further that both were incarcerated on the date of the assassination.

On Pebruary 7, 1964, Mrs. D. C. JACKSON was located at Sheriff's Apartments, U.S. Highway 85, north of Las Cruces, New Mexico, She claimed to have recently married D. C. JACKSON and stated that she had formerly resided at 441 El Molino Street in Las Cruces, New Mexico, with HOWARD WILLIAM FISHER. She stated that she had once been married to GEORGE MC NALLEY, now deceased, who died in Pontiac, Michigan over a year ago. She stated she had not used the name MC NALLEY in Las Cruces and that GEORGE MC NALLEY had never been in Las Cruces to her knowledge. Mrs. JACKSON stated that her first name is FLOY and that she went by the name of PLOY PISHER while residing on El Molino Street. Mrs. JACKSON stated that she had never, at any time, heard FISHER state that he would kill President Kennedy or refer in any manner to Buch an act. She stated further she had never expressed the opinion that Kennedy should be killed and that any statement to the effect that she had so stated was a false statement. Mrs. JACKSON stated that she recalled during the summer of 1963, that FISHER had brought home an individual named THOMAS TENNANT, whom he claimed had been in the Air Force with him. She stated that FISHER and TENNANT ran around together in the area for a while; that FISHER had supposedly wrecked her Chevrolet Station Wagon in Juarez, Mexico, and that she had never received payment for same. She stated that TENNANT claimed to be some kind of an officer and stated that he was from Washington, D.C. She stated that on one occasion, she had questioned him concerning why he had no credentials and he told her that he was working on a case wherein he was to pick up a man in Alamogordo, New Mexico, and take him to Santa Pe, New Mexico. She stated that she knew little concerning TENNANT, but that statements to the effect that FISHER had indicated that he intended to kill President Kennedy or that she had indicated that she thought the President should be killed were entirely false.
