I am shocked and discouraged to read in the New York Times, 12/8/63, that the Secret Service has "suggested to her (Marina Oswald) that it might be safer and easier for her to return to the Soviet Union than to try to live in the United States."

Worth area that above all else SHE DID NOT WANT TO RETURN TO THE SOVIET UNION, one is forced into a questioning position regarding the spontaneity of her recent testimony before the Warren Commission.
