Dear Mr. Rankin:

Reference is made to your letter of March 20, 1964, requesting advice as to whether the paper bag found on the eighth floor of the Texas School Book Depository Building (Commission Exhibit 142) might have originated in either of Oswald's two previous places of employment which were the Jaggers-Chiles-Stovall Company and the William B. Deiley Company.

A sample of paper was obtained from the Jaggers-Chiles-Stovall Company, Dallas, Texas, and was designated as FBI Exhibit D-105. Samples of paper and three-inch Manila gummed tape were obtained from the William B. Deiley Company, New Orleans, Louisiana, and were designated as FBI Exhibit D-106. The papers and gummed tape comprising Exhibits D-105 and D-106 were found to be different from the paper and gummed tape of Commission Exhibit 142.

The Jaggers-Chiles-Stovall Company has advised that the company has had no three-inch gummed tape on the premises in the last several years. It is noted that the gummed tape of Commission Exhibit 141 is three inches wide.

The paper sample D-105 was obtained from the Jaggers-Chiles-Stovall Company on March 24, 1964, and the company advised that the paper which was being used during March and April 1964 during the time of employment of Oswald had been taken up.

The paper and tape sample D-106 was obtained on March 23, 1964, from the William B. Deiley Company and the company advised that the paper and tape used during March and April 1964 during the time of employment of Oswald had been taken up.
